The police has registered an FIR on the basis of the statement of deceased's father. Police have taken into custody two suspects and interrogating them.

## World Bicycle Day-2021: Here's how doctors like to unwind

PRAYAGRAJ, ( **Hindusthan Samachar** ) : June 3 (HS): Cycling has become a popular sport among city doctors as a method to stay physically and emotionally healthy during these pandemic times. To de-stress and stay active, the doctors in Prayagraj embark upon group cycling rides twice a week, covering 40 to 60 kilometres each. Dr. Atul Dubey, Dr. Jaivardhan Rai, Dr. Arun Kant, Dr. Yugantar Pandey, Dr. Chhiti Srivastava, Dr. Subodh Jain, and Dr. Pankaj Gupta formed a cycling group called Two Wheels Thrill in November-December 2018—much before the Coronavirus took the world by storm. 'Two Wheels Thrill' cycling

group serves as a means to unwind with friends and stay in shape while taking a vacation from their stressful and frequently high-pressure jobs.

"At the moment, the group has 28 regular members. We used to go on bike trips to Varanasi and Chitrakoot before the pandemic, but now, during the pandemic, we prefer scenic places on the outskirts of the city, such as Shringverpur, Sujawan Dev temple, Maharishi Durvasa Ashram, or even Kaushambi. These sites allow us to ride in quiet while keeping social distance and increasing our stamina and immunity," said Dr. Yugantar Pandey, a famous paediatrician and former

secretary of the Allahabad Medical Association.

"Most of us in the group are aged between 45 and 65 years," said Dr. Anil Shukla, former president of Allahabad Medical Association. "Our brotherhood has suffered greatly as a result of the pandemic, and we have lost many dear colleagues. We discovered that cycling was a terrific stress reliever in the midst of work stress and personal issues, and that cycling twice a week helped us to prepare for the days ahead. So, this was our go-to stay-fit slogan during the pandemic," he added. Their female counterparts are not far behind and have founded their own cycling team, the Prayagraj Pacers. "In

After the news spread like wildfire, hundreds of people from Baijalpur village and other areas thronged the orchard to catch a glimpse of the dead peacocks. ## In Talks With Pfizer, Johnson &amp; Johnson, and Moderna to Source, Manufacture Vaccines in India: Centre



New Delhi : Discussions are underway with major pharma companies about sourcing and possibly manufacturing their COVID-19 jabs locally while India is looking forward to WHO's nod for Bharat Biotech's indigenously developed vaccine, Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla said on Thursday. Addressing the World Health Organisation's South-East Asia Regional Health Partners' Forum on COVID-19 he also said the government has worked with key partners to ease regulatory disruptions to vaccine supply chains through diplomatic interventions. India is fighting an "exceptionally severe" second wave of the contagion and it will participate in the process of creating global scale capacities that are needed to deal with pandemic-scale challenges, Shringla said. He said a number of serious global conversations are underway on this in platforms such as the G7, G20, QUAD, BRICS, the United Nations and WHO itself. India is also working with several other countries in the WTO on a targeted and temporary waiver under TRIPS

to ensure timely and secure access to vaccines for all, the foreign secretary said. The country will participate fully in the international process of regeneration through building newer and more resilient supply chains by focusing on newer technologies, knowledge-driven opportunities and leveraging its strengths and capacities. We are also part of discussions with major vaccine manufacturers like Pfizer, Johnson and Johnson, and Moderna about sourcing and possible local manufacturing of their vaccines in India. We have also helped to expedite the introduction of the Sputnik-V vaccine. "Vaccines have complex supply chains. We have worked to ease regulatory disruptions to these supply chains with key partners through diplomatic interventions. We are also looking forward to WHO's approval for India's indigenous vaccine made by Bharat Biotech," Shringla said.

He said the COVID-19 pandemic is now well into its second year and India is fighting an "exceptionally severe" second wave. "We have lived through a series of extraordinary

stresses and shocks. We are dealing with unprecedented economic and social disruptions and distress." Challenges of nature like the coronavirus pandemic require a response at multiple levels. Nationally, it requires not just a whole-of-government approach but a whole-of-society approach. It also is required that solutions and capacities are sourced globally basis, he said.

## India's domestic air passenger traffic down by 65-67% from April to May: Icra



Mumbai : As the number of Covid-19 infections rose, domestic passenger traffic for the Indian aviation sector crashed to around 1.9 to 2 million in May this year from around 5.73 million in April, revealed rating agency Icra. It also said the average number of flights that departed daily was around 900 in May significantly lower than the 2,000 departures in April this year. The agency said the average number of passengers per flight during May was 72 against an average of 93 passengers per flight in April, 2021. "The gradual decline depicts

the continuous stress on demand, driven largely by the second wave of Covid-19, limiting travel to [people] only taking flights when necessary," said Kinjal Shah, vice president and co-group head, Icra.

According to Icra, there was a sequential decline of approximately 65-67% in domestic passenger traffic from April to May this year, which, said Shah, meant that "domestic passenger traffic was lower than the June-July 2020 levels." "Icra said that the airlines' capacity deployment for May was lower by 54% to 55% compared to April (around 27,700 departures in May, against around 60,300 departures in April), indicating the lower demand stemmed from the averseness of consumers to travel due to the rise in infections," Shah added.

## Travelling safe during Covid pandemic: Transmission in taxi, bus and auto

Mumbai : A person is almost 300 times more likely to contract the coronavirus disease (Covid-19) sitting in an air-conditioned (AC) taxi with a passenger, who is Covid positive, than she is sitting in an autorickshaw, a recent study by two scientists at the Johns Hopkins University (JHU), Bloomberg School of Public Health, Department of Environmental Health and Engineering, found.

The probability of catching the infection is reduced by 250% in a taxi with the windows rolled down (non-AC) compared to one where the air conditioning is on. The researchers calculated that the risk in both types of taxis was reduced by 75% when the vehicles sped up from zero to 120km/hour.

The study titled "Risk analysis of different transport vehicles in India during COVID-19 pandemic" by Darpan Das and Gurumurthy Ramachandran was published in the peer-reviewed journal, Environmental Research, on May 11. While Das is a postdoctoral fellow at JHU, Ramachandran is a professor in the environmental health and engineering department.

The researchers calculated the chances of contracting Covid-19



infection in four vehicles common to Indian metropolises AC taxi, non-AC taxi, bus and auto rickshaw using a range of ventilation rates (air exchanges per hour) taken from previous studies and found that autos were the safest of the four options. All scenarios accounted for the presence of one index patient in the stationary vehicle and with everyone five travellers in each of the vehicles except the bus, which seated 40 wearing a mask (surgical or cloth). Compared to the auto, the risk was 86 times higher in a non-AC taxi and 300 times more in an AC taxi (probability of infection: 0.000199, 0.0171, 0.061 respectively). A person was 72 times more likely to contract Covid-19 in a non-moving bus with its windows open and seating 40 people (probability of infection: 0.0143), compared to an auto surrounded by four others, including the index patient.
